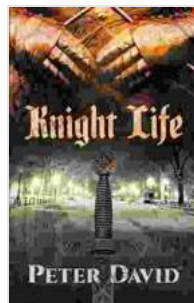


Knight Life: Peter David's Unconventional Approach to Arthurian Legend

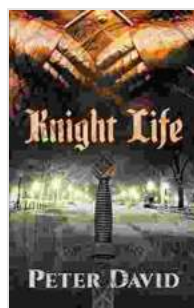
Peter David is an American comic book writer and novelist. He is best known for his work on the *X-Factor*, *Hulk*, and *Spider-Man* comic book series.

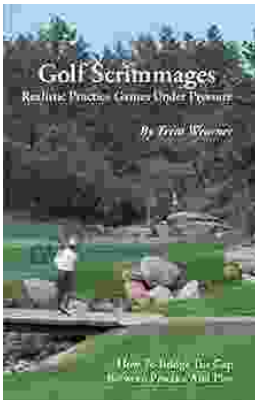
