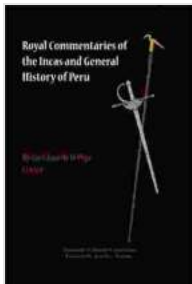


Royal Commentaries of the Incas and General History of Peru, Parts One and Two

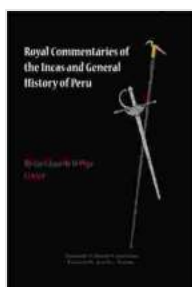

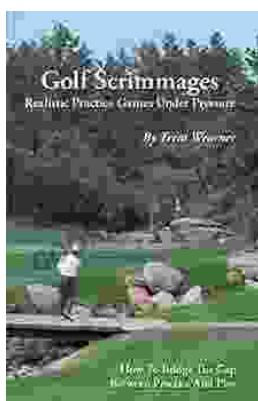
